

Saving Your Movie

Now that your movie is complete, you may wish to save the project in a different format.

- The movie project is the working file so that you may continue to edit until you have a final version of your work completed.
- The movie file is the final output of your movie. Windows Movie Maker compresses all the parts of your movie into a single file.

You can split a video into 2 separate parts by going to clip and selecting "split".

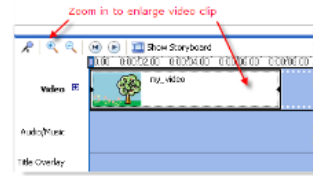

You can apply video effects to your movie which will apply to the picture itself instead of the transition between pictures.

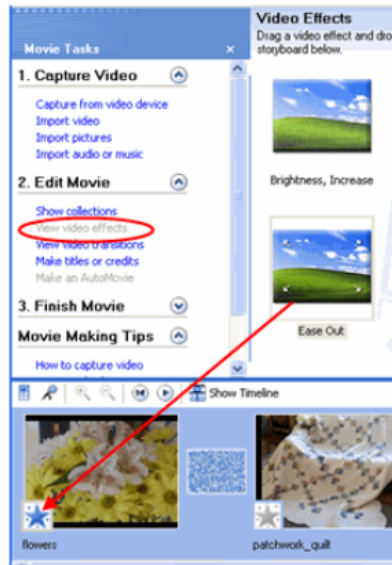

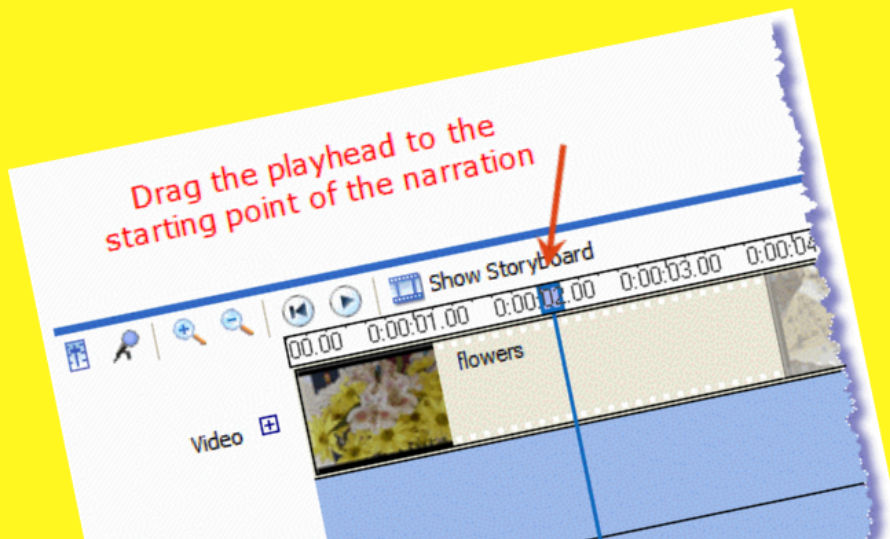

1. Input level- this allows you to adjust the volume of the audio that you will record.
2. Audio device allows you to select more than one recording device if you have multiple.
3. Audio input source - lists any audio devices that are attached to your computer
