The aim of teaching English for Special Purposes is to familiarize you with the English language in the field of pedagogical studies. Specifically, the aim is to enhance the four language skills (writing, reading, listening and speaking), with emphasis on the subject of study, the terminology of pedagogical science, oral presentation and research. Cultural language elements will be included.





English for Specific Purposes I: Skills building

You will study core elements of English language at level C and develop knowledge and skills in:

- grammar and vocabulary, with emphasis on the terminology of educational sciences
- reading a variety of texts from different genres
- critical studying and searching for information in articles, research papers and books in the field of Educational Sciences
- academic writing, paraphrasing, summarizing and creation of presentations
- active listening and note-taking, with the aim of attending lectures and seminars
- communication and presentation of scientific work
- the use of ICTs for digital literacy, communication, information retrieval and content creation
- collaboration, teamwork in projects

English for Specific Purposes I: Assessment

- During the semester:

Assignment Evaluation Criteria

- Content: Accuracy of information and evidence, well-supported arguments, the assignment deals with the assigned topic and responds to all aspects (30%)
- Avoidance of plagiarism via paraphrasing, summarizing and quoting (30%)
- Critical thinking Evaluation: Interpretation of the subject matter, argumentation, synthetic and analytical approach, creativity (10%)
- Structure: Organization / coherence (10%)
- Language/expression/clarity: Appropriate use of academic language, appropriate punctuation, grammar, spelling (10%)
- Bibliography: Adequacy of bibliographic references, appropriate use, autonomous source finding (10%)
