
Divergent thinking - Convergent thinking

Divergent thinking: creative thinking that may follow many lines of thought and tends to generate new and original solutions to problems. Αποκλίνουσα σκέψη.

Convergent thinking: logical thinking (as in answering a multiple-choice question) that weighs alternatives within an existing construct or model in solving a problem or answering a question to find one best solution and that is measured by IQ tests.




Intelligence - Direction
